LANG 101 Language Acquisition - Beginning Level I Units: 3.00

For students studying abroad or at a Canadian University who wish to learn a modern language other than English and who have no previous knowledge of that language. A basic level of understanding, speaking, reading, and writing in the language. An introduction to elements of culture of the countries in which the language is spoken.

Learning Hours: 120 (36 Lecture, 84 Private Study) **Requirements:** Prerequisite None. Equivalency LANG P10. Offering Faculty: Faculty of Arts and Science

LANG 102 Language Acquisition - Beginning Level II Units: 3.00

For students studying abroad or at a Canadian University who wish to learn a modern language other than English and who have no previous knowledge of that language. A basic level of understanding, speaking, reading, and writing in the language. An introduction to elements of culture of the countries in which the language is spoken.

Learning Hours: 120 (36 Lecture, 84 Private Study) Requirements: Prerequisite None. Equivalency LANG P11.

LANG 201 Language Acquisition - Advanced Level I Units:

For students studying abroad or at a Canadian University who wish to learn a modern language other than English and who have acquired a basic knowledge of that language. An increased emphasis on the study of the grammatical structures of the language and on the acquisition of vocabulary. Practice in speaking, reading, and writing. **Learning Hours:** 120 (36 Lecture, 84 Private Study) Requirements: Prerequisite (LANG 101 and LANG 102) or (LANG P10 and LANG P11) or permission of the Department of Languages, Literatures and Cultures. Equivalency LANG 120. Note A language placement test will be administered by the host university.

LANG 202 Language Acquisition - Advanced Level II Units: 3.00

For students studying abroad or at a Canadian University who wish to learn a modern language other than English and who have acquired a basic knowledge of that language. An increased emphasis on the study of the grammatical structures of the language and on the acquisition of vocabulary. Practice in speaking, reading, and writing. **Learning Hours:** 120 (36 Lecture, 84 Private Study) **Requirements:** Prerequisite (LANG 101 and LANG 102) or (LANG P10 and LANG P11) or permission of the Department of Languages, Literatures and Cultures. Equivalency LANG 121. Note A language placement test will be administered by the host university.
